- This position replaces the Leave No Trace Trainer Position
- The Outdoor Ethics Guide helps the Troop plan and conduct an outdoor program that emphasizes effectively practicing the principles of outdoor ethics. The Guide works to help Scouts improve their outdoor ethics decision making skills to help minimize impacts as they participate in outdoor activities
- The principles are laid out in the Outdoor Code, the Leave No Trace Principles, and the Tread Lightly! Principles.

Duties:

- 1. Explain and Demonstrate Outdoor Ethics related Advancement Requirements
- 2. Help Your Unit Plan and Conduct an Effective Outdoor Ethics Program
- 3. Thoroughly familiarize himself with the Outdoor Ethics material found in the 14th edition of the *Scout Handbook* and the BSA *Fieldbook*.
- 4. Develop and Lead Instructional sessions on the Outdoor Ethics program as directed by the Scoutmaster.
- 5. Prepare Den Chiefs to Share Principles
- 6. Help Scouts to Understand and Plan Conservation Activities
- 7. Encourage Scouts to Complete Outdoor Ethics Awards and Merit Badges
- 8. Attend at least 75% of troop events
- 9. Sets a good example
- 10. Wears the designated full uniform to all Troop activities
- 11. Shows Scout Spirit
